





COLLINGBOURNES AND EVERLEIGH GARDENING CLUB

Patti Marsh (01264 850319) writes:

Our chairman, Caroline Bouwens, welcomed everyone to the meeting and after notices about future events introduced Thomas Stone who talked about Mottisfont Abbey Gardens – Not Just a Rose Garden. His father



worked at Mottisfont and Thomas lived in the Abbey grounds from the age of four and at sixteen started working on the estate, so he knows the background very well. After thirty years he decided to go freelance.

Thomas explained that there has been a settlement at Mottisfont since at least the Saxon times*. It is on the banks of a natural stream which once supplied the entire village and worked the mill where locally grown wheat was ground. The main house began as an Augustinian monastery in 1201 but in 1684 following Henry VIII's reign, it became a private house. In the 1930s it was purchased by Mr and Mrs Gilbert Russell who entertained on a lavish scale; Ian Fleming was a regular visitor and another guest, the artist Rex Whistler, painted the large saloon in a three-dimensional effect. Mrs Russell gave the Abbey and gardens to the National Trust in 1954.

On the estate a canal was dug off the River Test and this runs around the grounds and is home to many trout, safe from the fishermen on the Test. The gardens comprise of herbaceous borders, a walled garden, a kitchen garden and six miles of walks around the estate where you can admire the wild flowers and many trees that have been planted over the years. Thomas definitely inspired us to visit Mottisfont and enjoy the experience for ourselves.

Following government advice, we have decided to cancel the March and April meetings. Hopefully we can invite both these speakers, Anne Keenan and Amanda Bradshaw, to come and talk at a later date.



WHAT'S FOR DINNER?

Pennyfarthing gives us a tempting recipe:

Baked Salmon with Parmesan and Parsley Crust

Serves 6

6 x 5oz salmon filets, skinned Salt and pepper Butter if necessary Chopped fresh parsley



SAUCE

2½ fl oz white wine6 oz chestnut mushrooms, sliced10 fl oz double cream

TOPPING

1 oz fresh white breadcrumbs 1 oz parmesan, coarsely grated 2 tbs chopped fresh parsley Grated rind of ½ lemon Paprika

METHOD

Measure wine and mushrooms into a pan and boil for 1 minute. Lift out the mushrooms with a slotted spoon and reduce wine to about 2 tbs. Add the cream, bring to boil and reduce to a sauce consistency. Season. Return mushrooms to the sauce and allow to cool completely.

Season both sides of salmon and arrange in a buttered ovenproof dish.

Spoon a little of the cold mushroom mixture on each salmon filet, but do not spread to the edge. Sprinkle the breadcrumbs, parmesan, parsley and lemon rind on the mushroom mixture and sprinkle lightly with paprika. Cover and leave in the fridge for up to 24 hours if necessary. Save the rest of the sauce, to reheat and serve separately.

Bake uncovered for 10 to 15 minutes at 350F. Sprinkle with more chopped parsley and serve immediately. Serve with new potatoes and a crisp green vegetable. Tip – may need to double up on the sauce!


WORD CHUMS
