Denis Bottomley, Chairman, (01264 852731) writes: Our Everleigh Enhancement plans remain on track. Spring plants have been deployed for our eight planters which are enriching



the appearance of the village. We have also chosen a new picnic bench for the playground and a new park bench for Everleigh centre to replace the wooden bench by the Manor fence. These benches will be delivered and set out in due course.



On Sunday morning, 16th July, we intend to walk the parish boundary to commemorate the ancient ceremony of Beating the Bounds of Everleigh Parish. The plan is to assemble at 9 am at the Everleigh Playground in the vicinity of the park bench by the southern pedestrian gate and then conduct a leisurely eight-mile hike

around most of our scenic parish boundary, to finish at about 1 pm.

The pace will be leisurely and will explore the beautiful countryside from the Dropping Zone to Everleigh Ashes, through Lower Everleigh and back to the Everleigh Playground. A safety vehicle will accompany walkers throughout.

I hope that you are all enjoying the glorious weather we have been experiencing in

Collingbourne Kingston over the past few weeks. Although, I suspect that many of you who are gardeners and farmers would like a little more rain. For those who like to get out and about in our lovely countryside, you will see that we have continued to improve signage on the network of footpaths across the Parish and I hope that the refurbishment of our playground, next to the Village Hall, will start soon so that it can get some use later in the summer.

Your Parish Council has recently been advised that the Parish's Village Design Statement needs to be updated. It was originally prepared in 2003 and approved by what was then Kennet District Council in the following year. It forms an important reference document to be consulted by the local planning authority in considering planning applications within the Parish.

Many villages throughout the country have Village Design Statements which have enabled the local community to influence the design of buildings so that they reflect the existing and desired character and distinctiveness of the village they live in.

The document is required to be drafted and designed by a group of residents and the Parish Council is inviting members of the parish to join the working group currently being assembled. No special skills are required to be a member.

COLLINGBOURNES ROAD SAFETY WORKING GROUP (CRSWG) UPDATE Philip Palmer writes:

As summer has arrived sadly the M4 Dorset Coast Connectivity report hasn't. This piece of work is eagerly awaited by all at the Collingbournes Road Safety Working Group, because it will define the preferred solution to the connectivity issue and where our stretch of the A338 fits in with that. It may give us even more cause for concern if it is to be a key route or less concern if it is recommended not to be used for heavy commercial traffic and therefore defines how we proceed from here. So, with that in mind, we are seeking your help to tell us what is important to you about the A338. In this month's Courier, as a flyer, is a small questionnaire which I would urge you to complete. It will only take a few minutes to do and can be

returned to either myself or Helen Steele. I will also make arrangements for a designated 'post-box' in the village shop to receive completed questionnaires there to make it as easy as possible. Remember we are in this together and we need your voice to make sure that we represent what concerns you about the road.

Meanwhile I can report that Wiltshire Council is experiencing tough times due to 'hyperinflation' caused by the Ukraine war, so much so that they are struggling, despite the £22m from Government for road maintenance and an extra £3.6m specifically for potholes repairs, to maintain our road network. Read it for yourself by searching 'Highways Asset Management - Wiltshire Council' on the internet.

It's not a secret of privileged information, it is public so have a read. Our stretch of the A338 from the Knapp to Collingbourne Kingston will therefore be resurfaced between the Knapp and Cadley Road, but only surface dressed between the villages. I think that Wiltshire Council feel that they are alone in suffering from 'hyperinflation' and that the residents have some special reserve to pay for their vehicle damage caused by potholes as well as the rising cost of living. I understand that claims for pothole vehicle damage will not be decided until July meaning people will have to bear the cost to themselves for three-four months.

Finally, we will be having another public meeting on a date to be arranged. This is because it is, as above dependent on the connectivity survey and indeed your questionnaire responses which will define our mandate.


Darell Moulton died on Tuesday 23rd May from Motor Neurone Disease. Darell and his partner Graeme moved into Sunton in 1988. Darell professionally, was an acclaimed musician, a voice tutor and a piano teacher. Amongst his pupils at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts were Kenneth Branagh, Ralph Fiennes, Sean Bean, Tom Hiddleston and many other famous actors. In all Darell spent fifty years teaching singing at the Academy, his many pupils rose to become famous artists.

In the Village Darell soon established himself becoming involved in all aspects of village life. In 1993 he asked me how he could contribute and support the village hall. From this conversation Staddlestone Soirees emerged. Using his wide and varied contacts in the opera and music worlds, Darell arranged and organised some of the most prominent performers in these fields to appear in our village. Over the years the Concerts raised over £55,000, supporting the School, the Church, the Courier, the village hall, Wiltshire Air Ambulance, Naomi House and many other national charities. Darell also arranged for a Steinway Grand piano to be donated to the Hall and a Yamaha upright to be installed in St Andrew's Church.

Any villager who was lucky enough to visit Darell's garden could only marvel at the beautiful flowers and magnificent vegetables grown there. Several Gardening Club Summer Lunches were held in the garden. The quality of his dahlias, roses, fruit trees and vegetables won him many awards at the Village Flower Shows. Alongside his garden there were many different breeds of chicken nurtured along the old railway line.

Darell was a gentleman and a gentle man. He will be sadly missed by his many friends in Collingbourne and in the wider music world. Our thoughts are with Graeme.

FISH PIE WITH A CHEESY SAUCE

Simon Gilford writes:

OK, so last time I promised you a recipe in which you can use more of those capers you may have used in the tartare sauce, and here it is. This is my take on a traditional fish pie, but with a few added extras that make all the difference in my humble opinion. If you've made a fish pie before then you know exactly what to do – but why not try my version which includes cheese, boiled eggs, and those all-important capers?

I've been told that my recipes are a bit too detailed, so this is the short version:

INGREDIENTS (FOR 2 PEOPLE):

450g potatoes

2 bay leaves and several peppercorns

15g of capers (see I told you and you can add even more if you like them)

2 hardboiled eggs (quartered)

2 pieces of fish fillet (cod, salmon, haddock – basically whatever takes your fancy – or a fish pie mix which is usually about 300g or so of mixed fish)

1 handful of king prawns (uncooked or cooked)

1 ½ tbsp butter

1 ½ tbsp plain flour

300ml milk

3 tbsp double cream

50g grated mature cheddar (plus some for sprinkling)

METHOD:

Peel, chop and boil the potatoes. Make into mash how you usually make it – adding a knob of butter, double cream, salt and pepper and set this aside.

Hard boil your eggs, peel, quarter and set them aside.

Add the milk to a pan, place in your fish, the bay leaves, and several peppercorns. Bring to a boil and poach gently for 3 or 4 minutes (adding the prawns if you are using them raw for the last 2 minutes). Transfer the cooked fish into a baking dish, remove any skin, flake it into bite-size chunks if you used fillets, and strain the cooking liquid into a jug for your sauce.

Make a roux with the butter and plain flour and slowly add in the cooking liquid to make a traditional white sauce (Google is your friend if you don't know how to do this bit – other search engines are

available). Add in the grated cheddar and stir until your cheese sauce is done.

Pour the cheese sauce over the fish in the baking tray, add in the capers and eggs, fold it together, spoon the mash on top, and spread it out, however, you see fit.

Sprinkle over some more grated cheddar and bake in a preheated oven (200°C) for 15-20 minutes or until the top is nice and brown.

SERVING:

Serve and enjoy with your vegetable of choice – I strongly recommend some peas. Enjoy!

Neither Carrot Nor Stick

Upstairs Molly is holding a bark-versation with one of the village yappers. Any attempt to change her behaviour will be completely wasted. I have tried bribery, I have tried threats, I have tried cajoling, at one stage I even tried electronic hypersonic antibark. Nothing worked. My son has just walked in the door and the other dog has started. He tried reasoning with her, 'Why are you barking? There is no-one here!'

In a conversation about the failing numbers of regular church attendance, a fellow Christian suggested to me that I should not be hesitant in preaching Hell Fire and Damnation. The person had a

strong point. Religious institutions that stress attendance or hell continue to have good attendances. Fear is a great motivator! Hell separates the lost from those who get to be with the Lord. Most importantly for our sakes, 'C of E' cannot mean 'Christmas and Easter.'

Twenty-two years ago, as a nominally Christian primary school teacher, with no spare time and a young family, I went to Sunday Church because the pattern and structure of my life was missing something profound. At the time I felt I was barking at the wind.

I prefer to preach the God of Love, to say Jesus will make a difference in your life and in the lives of those you love. I believe that there is a unique connection when we meet in prayer and when we celebrate the Last Supper. I don't understand why people don't get the 'mindfulness' that we have practised for thousands of years. Why they cannot pick up that spiritual embrace when we gather to remember Jesus' promises. Like a good trainer or teacher, my desire is to seek to show the way by offering rewards. But then, I don't get why, when I have shown my dogs both carrot and stick, they still choose to bark at the wind.

I do get why people don't join us on a Sunday. I also know that in this UPF (ultra processed food) world they miss the 'slow food' of the soul. I would like others to come to the water and drink (messing with my metaphors).


